Chairman's Report, September 1997 to September 1998

Meetings

The International Lecture was held in the auditorium of Stuttgart University . Prof. Charles Kao Spoke on " Engineering the Future ". The meeting was very successful and attracted a good audience from the Universities Stuttgart, Fach Hochschule -Stuttgart, guest Professor from University Duisburg (Chairman of IEEE Germany),representative from VDI and from local industry. The audience appreciated the multicultural prospective offered by the speaker. Two new members were recruited by the MFI and several in pending.

The highlight of this year was our Eastern and Central European meeting which was held in Weimer and was attended by over eighty participant. The meeting was organised to meet our East European IEE colleagues and to established a close relationship with the eastern counterparts. The meeting showed the willingness and enthusiasm to work together in feature; proposals were put forward for meeting to be held in Gdansk - Poland or in Czech Republic. The executive committee is working to organised such meeting, watch for next news flash. The weekend program was opened with two lectures. Prof. Berta from Technical University of Budapest, described his work on the effect of electromagnetic fields (EMI and EMC) in every day life and Prof. Lipski from University Gdansk spoke about Polish education system and its problems. Next ,the four winning younger members papers were presented (for the first time a pre selection was necessary as significant number of competitor were keen to present their technical papers). The guest speaker Prof. Angela Newing who gave a very informative lecture on the development of Medical Radiation -invisible and visible' covering from earlier experiment with X-rays to the latest non-intrusive imaging technologies. The guest and family afternoon program was a visit to the Carl Zeiss Planetarium in Jena.

Regional meetings have not been as frequent as hopped, and were restricted to Hamburg., Munich and Stuttgart. Technical presentation were a talk on " Chaos" in Hamburg and Digital Television in Stuttgart.

Co-operation continues with Local Industry and VDI. We were able to help German student going to U K but very poor response from UK student who like to come for his training in Germany.
